#### **The Anointing Needs Humility**

King Saul is a much-maligned character in the Old Testament narrative. As such, he is an example of

how a man's choices later in life can destroy his reputation forever. But before there was a "King Saul" there was a simple man, the son of an almost unknown man named Kish of the tribe of the Matrites — a group mentioned only once in the whole of Scripture. He had one visible asset which might cause one to think him a leader: he was taller than most men (1 Samuel 9:2, 10:23).

At some point before this we know the Lord spoke to the prophet Samuel concerning this tall man from an unimportant father and an even less prominent tribe. Samuel received a command from the Lord to go after this goodly young man and anoint him to be "captain over my people" (1 Samuel 9:16). The anointing occurs without the word "king" being spoken into Saul's ear. Captain. A leader of men into battle. It was an important position, but nothing like what was about to come upon the young man.

Did Saul know the extent of what was actually happening when Samuel poured oil upon his head in 1 Samuel 10? Did he realize the very next step was to become the first earthly king of Israel? One thing is certain: once things began to happen, something gripped the young man's heart causing him to hide himself, as the King James Version says, "among the stuff" (1 Samuel 10:22). The "stuff" referenced here was the baggage and luggage of the camp. As Samuel spoke to the people of what the Lord was commanding concerning the king, young Saul hid himself. Why?

It is interesting to note that the most commonly accepted commentaries on this situation make

Saul's actions into either a testament to his personal insecurity, emotional frailty, or some other defect of character. Why could it not be that Saul was being humble? In fact, why wouldn't a prominent qualification for a godly leader of God's own people be humility? Do we not have sufficient examples, both in Scripture and history, of the pride of religious leaders bringing them down?

But, at some point, Saul lost his humility. Though still the anointed king of Israel and captain of God's people, on one occasion he failed to wait on Samuel and took upon himself the role of officiant in a sacrifice unto the Lord (1 Samuel 13). This cost Saul a perpetual dynasty on the throne of Israel. By 1 Samuel 15, Saul has yet again forgotten the boundaries of humility, assuming he had the right to contradict the command of God in the matter of the destruction of the Amalekites.

Saul was anointed king, that was undeniable. It was this anointing as king that David was unwilling to violate (1 Samuel 24:6). But the anointing on the life of Saul was of no use. He had been rejected by God because of his pride and arrogance against the Word and will of the Lord. The message here is simple and needs no further elaboration: no amount of anointing will make up for a lack of humility. May God help us start humble and stay humble under His mighty hand.

#### Preaching Point: Buffalo, Missouri

The small rural town of Buffalo, Missouri, has a population of a little over 3000 people. In this town, there is a nursing home named Buffalo Prairie Care Center, which is home to 40-50 people. My wife and I are privileged to hold church services there bi-weekly, with an average of 10-12 residents attending.

The residents there are a beautiful group of people, and they wait eagerly every other week to hear the singing and the preaching of the Word of God. But they don't just listen! They sing from their hearts and worship God in whatever way they can. They have many "reasons" why they could choose not to praise God. Some are missing limbs, some cannot lift their arms, some are confined to wheelchairs, and others are almost completely blind or deaf. Despite all of this, they are faithful to the Lord. Many of them are in constant pain, but they have a love for God and a desire to please Him.

We have seen some of these dear souls repent and call out to God. None have been baptized in Jesus' name yet, but I believe that is coming. Pray for these precious people and for others in the home who do not attend. Many feel lost and without hope. We want them to feel the peace, love, and hope that Jesus gives!

I also want to give honor to whom honor is due. Bro Raymond and Sis Kathy Schaefer have been meeting us at both Buffalo Prairie and Hermitage Nursing Home and have been a tremendous blessing to the work. May the Lord bless them richly for their faithfulness and consistency. •


